1. THE SCHOOL

Gordano School is a large and highly successful 11-18 comprehensive secondary school approximately eight miles outside Bristol. This includes a thriving Sixth Form of over 350 students that is strongly integrated into the school and offers significant opportunities for Post-16 teaching in over 30 courses. We are the sole secondary school serving the popular town of Portishead, and benefit greatly from being a central part of our community.

We view education as something bigger than just academic achievement. We have a record of considerable academic success, but believe that an education should be about preparing young people for their future lives in a complete sense. As well as consistently positive Progress 8 and Level 3 Value Added outcomes at GCSE and A Level respectively we place great emphasis on student leadership, an unparalleled extra-curricular programme and student progression to their next steps in a wide range of academic and vocational routes.

We pride ourselves on the very high quality support for colleagues at all stages of their career through internal and external CPD, including our membership of the Lighthouse Schools Partnership's Centre of Professional Development, with staff involved across all levels of NPQ programmes. We maintain significant involvement in Initial Teacher Training and deliver comprehensive ECT induction in association with the Five Counties Teaching School Hubs Alliance and Ambition Institute. Our very large staff body allows regular opportunities for progression into leadership roles at all levels.

We were judged Outstanding in all categories in our last Ofsted inspection, but, just as importantly, seek to be a very happy school community with a big heart. This has never been more evident than in the last few years, where we have been incredibly proud of the response from our brilliant staff, children and families to the Covid pandemic.

The Social Science Faculty consists of Business Studies and Economics, Psychology, Sociology and Health and Social Care Departments. The Faculty offer a range of traditional academic subjects at key stage 4 and 5 as well as BTEC qualifications in Business and Health & Social Care. Results are consistently very strong despite the wide ability ranges in the groups and Business and Psychology routinely provide some of the strongest outcomes in the school.

The Faculty is accommodated in the central part of the school. Most lessons take place in this area, including all Business Studies lessons. There are three dedicated IT suites in the main faculty area.

4. THE DT & COMPUTING FACULTY

Computing belongs to the DT & Computing Faculty, where there are 4 separate subjects taught at GCSE level: Computer Science, Design and Technology, Food Preparation and Nutrition and Art Textiles. We also currently offer a Level 2 Vocational Qualification in Constructing the Built Environment and the Cambridge National in iMedia.

At KS5 we offer 2 options in Computing: A-Level Computer Science and the Cambridge Technical in IT. There are 2 Design and Technology courses taught at A Level: DT Product Design and Art & Design: Textiles.

The Faculty boasts a team of 14 creative teaching practitioners, achieving consistently high results at GCSE and A Level. To support teachers in the delivery of their subjects, the faculty also has 3 technicians who are responsible for preparing resources, controlling stock, helping with practical demonstrations and who undertake administrative, display and clerical work when required.

There are a range of computer rooms across the school, all fully equipped with on average 30 computers, a teacher PC, interactive whiteboard and Impero software to support classroom management. The department has embraced new technologies including Office 365 with Microsoft OneNote being embedded practice for class work across all key stages. Lesson resources are shared across the department on SharePoint to facilitate efficient working practices in the cloud.

The Computing curriculum for 2022/2023 is as follows:

In Years 7 & 8, all students have 2 lessons a fortnight where they study a range of Computing, Digital Literacy and iMedia topics.

At the end of Yr8, students choose their optional subjects they wish to study and embark on a 3-year GCSE course. They choose from:

- □ OCR GCSE Computer Science
- □ Cambridge Nationals in iMedia

In Yr12, students can choose to study AQA Computer Science or Cambridge Nationals in IT (both the single and double award).
