This is an exciting time to join The Judd School as a member of this new, but fast-growing, department.

The Head of Department joined the school in September 2021; he builds on the work of the previous Head of Department in introducing taught discrete lessons across the curriculum. We now have a large cohort (28) studying A Level in Year 12, following a popular uptake of the GCSE course (currently over 100 in each year). Previously, we supported keen students, self-teaching towards an exam with great success.

In Key Stage 3, all students have a fortnightly Computing lesson, focussing on the National Curriculum, in Years 7 & 8. We are currently considering our approach for Year 9, as our first cohort receiving those discrete lessons moves up the school.
