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COMPUTING & BUSINESS STUDIES

Structure of the Faculty

Computing and Business Studies form a dedicated faculty led by the Director of Teaching & Learning for Digital Literacy. There is an assigned SLT line manager.

The faculty is an experienced, professional, and well-motivated team maintaining high standards and improving results year on year. We have dedicated computing suites that have recently undergone refurbishment, fully equipped with modern desktop PCs, an interactive whiteboard, and a wide selection of software to support the delivery of a newly updated curriculum. The faculty works together to develop and improve resources to ensure our students achieve excellent outcomes. Through a carefully planned curriculum, with guidance and support, we hope that every student can achieve the appropriate qualifications for the next stage of their lives.

Curriculum

Currently, we teach a three-year KS3 program of study and a two-year KS4 where we offer Computer Science. During KS3, all pupils have a one-hour lesson of computing per week to equip our students with a wide range of knowledge and skills to be proficient in a range of IT software. In KS3, students are taught in mixed-ability groups.

At KS4, we currently teach the OCR GCSE Computer Science (J277) course and are committed to promoting interest and the enjoyment of a range of programming techniques. Opportunities are provided for students to analyse problems in computational terms, including designing, writing, and debugging programs, in addition to understanding the impact of digital technology on the wider community, including issues with privacy and cybersecurity. Transferable skills such as research, planning, reviewing, thinking creatively, working with others, and communicating creative concepts effectively are developed throughout this course.

Our KS5 Computing qualification is delivered in-house, where we teach the OCR A-Level Computer Science (H446) course.

This vacancy provides an excellent opportunity for a forward-thinking teacher of Computing with drive and commitment, whose primary focus will be around the delivery of the KS3 Computing curriculum. The post would suit either an early career teacher or one with experience who is willing to play an active role in building on our current success.
