In the Sixth Form Computing averaged 85% A*-C (in the last two examined years 2018/2019) with an average ALPs score of 3.

The department is currently a team of three teachers delivering Computer Science at A Level and GCSE as well as BTEC Media at KS4 and KS5.

We are a dedicated and experienced team that provide all of the support that will be needed with the different courses. Average class sizes in KS4 is 20-25 students and at KS5 classes are usually between 10 and 12 students.
