CURRICULUM

Y7-9

We deliver an innovative and engaging computing curriculum that comprises of sixteen modules, designed to ensure students make progress from the end of Key Stage 2 through the entirety of the Key Stage 3 National Curriculum.

Our curriculum pathway is distilled into eight key concepts:

- Algorithms
- Programming
- Application Software
- Digital Media
- Computers
- Communication and the Internet
- Data
- Safety and ethics.

Y10-11

The Cambridge National Certificate in Creative I-media is taught across a two-year KS4 at years 10 and 11. We also offer the Cambridge National in Marketing & Enterprise.



Computer Science is only currently taught at KS3, but the successful applicant for this role will have the chance to build the department's offering across the KS4 curriculum from September 2022 when Computer Science will be offered for Year 9.

The successful applicant will have a clear vision for what the teaching of Computer Science/ICT/Business in the 21st Century ought to entail including curriculum choices.
