INSPIRE ACHIEVE CELEBRATE



The department consists of four teachers including the Director of Learning for Creative and Digital Technologies.

At KS3 students have two lessons a fortnight. Almost all classes in KS3 have the one teacher but there is a small minority of classes that have a shared teacher each delivering one lesson.

At KS3 we are introducing many changes and most units of work are new or have been remodelled to fit the computing programme of study. All teachers in the department are actively involved in developing the schemes of work and keeping up with the developments in technology.

At KS4 we follow the OCR syllabus for both Creative iMedia and Computer Science. Students can choose to study one or both of these subjects.

At KS5 we offer Computer Science and BTEC Information Technology. In Computer Science we follow the OCR specification. Students must achieve at least level 5 at GCSE Mathematics to gain entry onto the course. In the BTEC IT course students work towards the Level 3 Extended Certificate and complete units in Web Design, Social Media in Business, Information Technology Systems and Creating Systems to Manage Information.

A wide variety of extracurricular work goes on within the department; in recent years we have offered opportunities for the students to enrich their Computing experiences with Computer Coding Club, CC4G, Scratch Club, CAD club and Raspberry Pi and Micro:bit activities.

We also offer weekly drop in sessions for both KS4 and KS5 students.

The department is also involved in transition work and run sessions with students from our primary feeder schools. In these sessions students have worked on the Micro:bit and programmed the BitBot Robots as well as writing computer programs in Scratch.

We also have close links with MMU and students from the University have been invited into the school to deliver KS3 lessons.

Facilities

At present there are over 650 devices on the school network. The curriculum network runs on a Windows OS, individual machines use Windows 10 and Office 2019 Pro Plus.

There are 5 main IT suites allocated to the teaching of Technology and Computing. Most IT suites have at least 30 machines. There are also computers in the Learning Resources Centre, the Sixth Form building and several departmental areas are suited, including Languages, Humanities, English, Media and Music.

Internet Access is provided via 300Mbps broadband connection. The school has invested in remote access and all staff can access their school accounts and email from home.
