





Holyrood Academy is an 11-18 Academy in Somerset with approximately 1250 students on roll – including around 150 in the sixth form. It is situated in the centre of the market town of Chard and it is the only secondary school in the town. We are therefore fully comprehensive and committed to providing an excellent education in the service of our whole community.

Holyrood was last inspected in 2013 when it achieved an Outstanding rating.

Outcomes have been historically strong and despite the considerable challenges brought by the changes to KS4 programmes of study, we have consistently achieved a positive progress 8 score placing us as reliably one of the top performing secondary schools in Somerset.



Class breakdown

Year 7, 8 & 9 (3 lessons a fortnight)

We have 6 classes on one side of the year group and 6 on the other side. 4 groups rotate through 3 subjects, all having a term with their teacher. This requires teachers to teach across two specialisms at times.

- X2 Engineering Level 3




Our departments vision for education

Department information

In order to offer a world class Design and Technology curriculum to our students, there are several key aspects within our department that have to be blended together

- Outstanding teaching staff who fully engage with the challenges and changes in the subject. Staff who are reflective on their own teaching, will support the department team and create excellent environments for our students to thrive in. We also ensure that they have access to the best CPD opportunities.
- Outstanding learning spaces, ensuring that areas are considered, organised and allow a range of activities to take place.
- Links and contacts with development within teaching and learning. This is with SLT at the Academy, at Trust level and nationally.
- Excellent relationships with the students in our care.
- An invested interest in the teaching, care and futures of our students. This is forged through excellent relationships and a focus on developing the character attributes outlined by Damian Hinds.



Ever since I arrived at Holyrood I wanted the students to **love the subject**. All the staff in the department have a great love of D&T. Staff promote the subject values in their teaching every day. Activities in and out of the classroom are selected to allow our students to be stretched and challenged, to help them to think, develop and grow. Not only are our students choosing our subject, they are fully engaged and excited about the curriculum we teach.

The new member of the team will teach across all year groups and have the benefit of the support of a designated Design & Technology team. There is also technician support available throughout the week.

For September D2, D1 and the corridor (computer room, workshop and corridor space) are going to be renovated in line with the plan to expand the areas available for 6th Form students and for CAD/CAM equipment. This will give more space and allow us to better use this rooming.

Key Stage 3

In Year 7 and 8 students will study a range of subjects including Textiles & Fashion, Food & Nutrition and Resistant Materials. This will help students build strong relationships and help develop their confidence within the group and help encourage collaboration and professional development across the department.



In Year 9, students continue to work within these areas but the focus is on core technical knowledge through FPT associated with the required knowledge and skills.

Throughout Key Stage 3, teachers use a range of activities to engage students. Staff create opportunities for students to be leaders, work in teams and be competitive. These activities support our academy values and help our students to become confident and build resilience .

Students study D&T for 3 hours a fortnight in Years 7, 8 &9. In Food & Nutrition, we are very proud that we provide ingredients for all P/P students. I am very keen to ensure that all students cook. Parents/carers are asked to contribute financially to a small amount of the cost of D&T, but this is a voluntary option with about 75% uptake in year 7 and 60% uptake in year 8..




Key Stage 4

Students at Key Stage 4 follow a structured and sequenced programme which is not only linked to the awarding body specification but also gives our students the opportunity to continue studying the *wider design curriculum*. We feel that this also offers them opportunities when they leave us in Year 11.



We also use the time to develop students' individual interests through a range of activities such as;

- Visits to higher and further education establishments
- Entering of national competitions
- Engagement with industry and local companies
- Experience days
- Factory visits
- Museum days




Other department/ school information



Classroom responsibilities:

- To teach across the age and ability range in line with the Department's Schemes of Work and external examination courses in such a way to challenge and inspire students of all abilities to achieve high standards.
- Plan, prepare and teach lessons according to the students' educational needs with reference to prior attainment, subject targets, SEN and other needs, as required.
- Assess, record and report on the development, progress and attainment of students in line with Academy and department policies and procedures.
- Set high expectations for students' behaviour establishing and maintaining a good standard of discipline through well focused teaching, effective classroom management and through positive and productive relationships.
- Act within, the statutory frameworks, which set out their professional duties and responsibilities and in line with the duties outlined in the current School Teachers Pay and Conditions Document and Teacher Standards.
- To set and mark work for classes according to Academy and departmental guidelines.
- To set appropriate, quality homework in accordance with the Academy timetable.
- Liaise with support staff, such as Teaching Assistants, to ensure a coherent programme of study for students in the classroom.
- To follow Academy procedures for preparing, presenting and assessing students.
- Be a form tutor to a designated group of students supporting them academically and pastorally.
- Take an active part within the Academy's monitoring, evaluation and review programmes, professional development activities and teachers' Performance Management structures and cycle.
- Attend staff briefings and departmental meetings as required.
- Carry out a share of supervising duties in accordance with published schedules.
- Carrying out such other tasks commensurate with the above as may be required from time to time by the Headteacher.

Knowledge and understanding:



- Have a sound knowledge and understanding of the concepts and skills in his/her specialist subjects and a detailed knowledge and understanding of the National curriculum programmes of study.
- Understand for his/her specialist subjects the framework of 11-16 and sixth form qualifications and the routes of progression through it.
- Understand and know how national, local comparative and Academy data can be used to set clear targets for students' achievement.
- Understand how students' learning in the subject is affected by their physical, intellectual, emotional and social development.
- Be familiar with subject-specific health and safety requirements, where relevant, and plan lessons to avoid potential hazards.

Ensure that legislation and Trust policies and procedures relating to confidentiality and data protection are adhered to.


Special Factors
