A WELCOME FROM THE CEO OF THE FRANK FIELD EDUCATION TRUST



The Frank Field Education Trust (FFET) is a multi-academy trust (MAT) based in two Regional Schools Commissioners areas (L&WY and West Midlands) which aims to build on the work of the Outstanding teachers, leaders and schools within the Trust to serve the most disadvantaged schools and communities in England.

The founder and Chair of the Trust, the Rt. Hon. Lord Frank Field, served for almost 40 years as the Member of Parliament for Birkenhead. During this time, Frank has written extensively on education and, in 2010, wrote "The Foundation Years: preventing poor children becoming poor adults" report, which is regarded as a landmark document regarding the importance of education and Early Years care in ending disadvantage. The review found that the gap in cognitive, social and emotional skills between the most and least disadvantaged students starts well before children enter the education system. This gap widens still further during school years.

Our intention is to work with schools that buck this national trend, with the aim of equalising or bettering life chances by the time our young people leave school. We believe social justice can be achieved through excellence in education.

We welcome applications from people who share our ambition to provide an education for children that is unparalleled in this country and have the enthusiasm and drive to make this a reality.

ELLESMERE PORT, CHESHIRE

Ellesmere Port is a port town in the Cheshire West and Chester local authority area of Cheshire, England. Ellesmere Port is 6 miles north of Chester, 12 miles south of Birkenhead, 16 miles southwest of Runcorn and 11 miles south of Liverpool.

The town of Ellesmere Port was originally established on the River Mersey at the entrance to the Ellesmere Canal. As well as a service sector economy, it has retained large industries including Stanlow oil refinery, a chemical works and the Vauxhall Motors car factory. There are also a number of tourist attractions including the National Waterways Museum, the Blue Planet Aquarium and Cheshire Oaks Designer Outlet.

Job Purpose:

To teach your subject discipline, inspiring students to have a passion for the subject and an understanding of its key ideas, concepts and skills. To be explicit in modelling and developing models for learning and mental schema so that students can make connections and apply their learning in a variety of contexts. To continuously improve classroom practice and achieve excellent student outcomes.

Critical Responsibilities

- Under the reasonable direction of the Principal, carry out the professional duties of a school teacher as set out in the current School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document (STPCD).
- To ensure all students engage in learning and achieve, through careful planning of the structure, methodology and delivery of the learning experience.
- To use assessment data to plan next step learning and overcome individual barriers to learning.



Design Technology Department Information

Design & Technology at The Ellesmere Port Church of England College is a vibrant, up-and-coming department with a well-developed sense of community. We are currently on a journey of growth and are already reaping rewards with our increasing pupil numbers at both KS4 and KS5. Our aim in D&T at EPC is to deliver an inspiring and rigorous curriculum that encourages our pupils to be creative and innovative risk-takers, whilst acquiring a broad range of subject knowledge that draws on disciplines such as science, mathematics, engineering, computing and art. Through the design and manufacture of products and dishes that solve real and relevant problems, we can enable our pupils to make essential contributions to the culture, wealth and well-being of our community and beyond.

The Team:

There are five specialist teachers in the Design and Technology department and a full-time technician who ably supports both design technology and food technology. At Key Stage 3 our staff teach across the Design & Technology areas, teaching their material specialism at Key Stage 4 and 5.

Facilities

The Design & Technology department has five specialist rooms which are spacious and well resourced. These consist of three workshops with graphics tables and practical workbenches (served by a technician's preparation room); one food technology room with 11 ovens; and a graphics/computing room with a suite of laptops that can be used in all D&T rooms. Other ICT provision includes a CAD/CAM room with a range of equipment including a laser cutter and 3D printer.

Curriculum

At Key Stage 3, our pupils are allocated four hours each fortnight and rotate on a seven or 14 week carousel to develop their knowledge and skills in all design & technology material areas. We currently have five design & technology groups per year group with all class size numbers below 22 pupils.

At Key Stage 4, our pupils are allocated five hours each fortnight. We offer qualifications in:

- GCSE Design & Technology (OCR)
- Level 1/2 Hospitality & Catering (WJEC)

We currently have three groups in Year 10 completing their GCSE in Design & Technology and three groups in Year 10 completing their Level 1/2 vocational qualification in Hospitality and Catering. As with KS3, all our KS4 class size numbers are below 22 pupils. Our Sixth Form students completing their A Level have eight lessons per fortnight.

We currently offer the qualification:

A Level Design & Technology: Product Design (OCR)

Based in Handforth, near Manchester, this outstanding primary school and National Support School leads the way in innovative curriculum development and inclusion.


Birches Head Academy
