I am delighted that you are considering applying for this important role here at The Crypt School. The position of teacher of Food Preparation & Nutrition is a growing role at the school, as its popularity grows, especially at GCSE level. I do hope that you find this information helpful and we look forward to receiving your application.

Founded in 1539 and set in nearly 30 acres of grounds, The Crypt School's vision is derived from its Latin motto, "Floreat Schola Cryptiensis": floreat means "to flourish" and at The Crypt we wish all our students, as well as our staff, to flourish in all that they do. In order to achieve that vision, we strive to create the best possible environment and culture within which our students can learn, develop essential key skills and personal attributes, make friends and enjoy their school lives; equally, we wish for our staff to flourish

in their work at school, and always strive to place their welfare at the centre of our work and planning. The School has grown significantly over the last five years, especially since the admission of girls into the main school in September 2018. Today, The Crypt School is Gloucester's only co-educational selective school with a student roll of over 1100. The student body is a diverse, caring and enthusiastic one and our staff are a highly professional, caring and generous group of people who commit themselves fully to the academic, pastoral and extra-curricular life of the School. The School is a vibrant place to both learn within and to work at; it is a place where learning is valued for its own sake, within an environment of strong pastoral care. At the centre of our school life, is a powerful sense of community, where students are supported and encouraged to learn and engage with each other. Confident, friendly and respectful, the high quality of our student's personal development is remarkable and is one of the greatest strengths of the School.

The School has benefited from significant capital investment over recent years which has enhanced the learning environment for both students and staff alike. Recent projects have included the building of two new teaching blocks and a sports pavilion; the refurbishment of the sports hall and the creation of an outdoor netball and tennis area, as well as the creation of a new physics laboratory. We continue the refurbishment of the older parts of the school, and this summer we plan a major investment to enhance facilities in our sixth form centre.



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In March 2024, the School received an outstanding Ofsted report in all areas: that was a result of the dedication to the vision and values of the school, from all of our stakeholders - staff, students, Governors and our families at home.

Staff aty the school do work hard and give generously of their time to the life and wellbeing of the School. Time and money is invested in their professional development, and each member of the teaching staff is equipped with a laptop and iPad; other benefits also enhance the working experience of colleagues at the School (<a href="https://cryptschool.org/explore-our-school/work-with-us/">https://cryptschool.org/explore-our-school/work-with-us/</a>)

The Crypt School is located just outside of the City of Gloucester in the West of England. Gloucester is known for its 11<sup>th</sup> century Cathedral and close; for Blackfriars, which is a stunning example of a 13th century mediaeval priory site; the British Waterways Museum, which celebrates the city's industrial past, and now the vibrant Gloucester Quays, which has a selection of shops and restaurants. Gloucester is a vibrant and growing city, and the School is conveniently located close to the City, and close to good road and rail links to Cheltenham and the surrounding region, including Bristol for example.

The Food room is set up to accommodate 20 students for practical work. The facility is a modern and well-resourced room. It sits next to two art rooms and two DT rooms. One DT room is mainly dedicated to design-based work with desktop computers. It also houses a laser cutter and 3D printers. The second DT room is a smaller multi-function workspace – it has its own laser cutter and is partly used for design work and as a workshop for light practical tasks. This sits next to the main workshop - plans are in place to redevelop this workshop into a design studio, to facilitate the delivery of the new curriculum in graphic design communication. There is a designated 6th form work study room in addition to this, which collectively make up the Dart Faculty.

At KS3, students are taught in groups of approximately 20 and are rotated between DT specialists to allow students to experience grounding in a variety of design and Food based skills. The students in Key Stage 3 work from iPad and staff are also issued with one and are encouraged to embed its use in their delivery of lessons, in addition to other ICT based provision, to reflect a digital world.

At KS4, students study AQA Food Preparation and Nutrition. Art students study AQA Art Craft and Design to reflect the variety of provision explored at KS3. DT students currently study Design Technology, Pearson exam board with a current focus on timbers. However, the faculty is preparing for a change to Graphic Communication at exam-based level in a bid to develop and reflect more contemporary practice.

Students are expected to achieve their highest standard of work in the faculty at all times. We operate an open-door system most lunchtimes and after school much of the time. Extra-curricular provision via lunchtime clubs is an expectation of the staff within the faculty.

There are five members of the teaching staff within the faculty, in addition to two part-time technicians (one who works in the food and nutrition room). Staff work as a team across the faculty and are normally involved in teaching across the Key Stages predominantly within their specialism area. With a reputation for consistently good results in all areas, the faculty remains dedicated to responding to changes in the evolving workplace. We actively support Initial Teacher Training programes and welcome trainee teachers into the Faculty each year and would therefore welcome those who could continue with this mentoring role.

- use the school and departmental policies and practices for assessing, recording and reporting on students' achievement, and uses this information to recognise achievement and to assist students in setting targets for further development;
- ensure that information about students' achievement in previous classes and schools is used effectively to secure good progress in the subject;



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- set high expectations and establishes clear targets for students' achievement, and evaluates progress and achievement in the subject by all students;
- ensure that there are opportunities for the effective development of students' individual
  and collaborative study skills necessary for them to become increasingly independent in
