- Ensure that our policy relating to health and relationships education is in place and reviewed in line with statutory review dates, and ensure it is up-to-date with the school's current circumstances and the latest legislation/guidance.
- · Increase the percentage of students who can age-appropriately show understanding around all aspects of relationships and consent, during debate and discussions.

Intended impact



- Basics at KS4: 9-4 80% 9-5 55%, KS5: B
