



- Have the drive to transform students' learning and be dedicated to raising standards even further for all students.

We are looking to recruit someone with a passion for teaching Design and excellent subject knowledge to join our hardworking, innovative Design department ideally from January 2022 or as soon as possible afterwards. The department has well-established schemes of work and places a strong emphasis on developing the 4 main areas of assessment from Key stage 3 and advancing these skills and abilities to prepare students for future progression at Key stage 4,5 and beyond. The successful applicant will be well-supported throughout their time here.

Department facilities

The department consists of two design studios and one large manufacturing area with separate material storage. The rooms are equipped with pod style tables to encourage group style working. Design software is available on all PCs in school including Google sketch up and 2D Design as well as dedicated PCs in both design studios.

Both design studios are equipped with AV screens and projectors for digital presentation and contextual lessons. The manufacturing area is a flexible room designed to be adapted to suit different group requirements with a wide range of tools and equipment, i.e. wood lathe, wide range of battery powered routers, drills sanders, jigsaws, pillar drills, long panelled 'clean' benching, laser cutter and a CADCAM router in studio one to provide the widest possible opportunities for all our students.

The Design Curriculum


At Key Stage 3 our students receive wide and diverse schemes of work designed to challenge and progress their skills not just in terms of practical manufacture but to expand their thinking in terms of inclusion, cultural and demographic markets in creative and innovative ways. There is a clear emphasis on the NC areas of assessment: Design, Making, Evaluation and Technical knowledge.

In Key Stage 4 we deliver the AQA Design Technology specification, which includes developing and extending the foundation 4 main area skills from key stage 3. This is a two year programme with a final GCSE award in year 11. Students will apply the theory, design and manufacturing processes learned during Year 10 to a final NEA Design Challenge set by the exam board and a single 2 hour contextual exam in the second year.

In Key stage 5 we deliver the EDUQAS Product Design specification, which is a demanding course with a heavy emphasis on innovation and high-level manufacturing. This is a two-year programme with a final A level award in year 13, comprising an NEA coursework unit and a single 3 hour contextual exam. This is a very rewarding course and a high percentage of our students continue to study the subject at degree level.

Across all stages it is important that students are taught the importance of:

- Relevant and analytical research
- Creative design techniques and purposeful annotation
- Measurable specification writing
- Industrial manufacturing techniques
- Reflective evaluation methods
- Communication through drawing and writing

- Operational and strategic planning (including lesson planning, developing resources and syllabuses which support the department Scheme of Work contributing to the departmental plan)
- Curriculum planning alongside Head of Department
- Staff development (including continuing professional development and engaging fully in the Performance Management Review process)
- Quality assurance (including contributing to the process of assessment both i.e. verbal, written and smart
 marking etc. as well as assisting in the evaluation of the department programme of study in line with the National Curriculum for Design Technology.)
- Management of information (including maintaining appropriate records and tracking student progress)
- Communications with students and parents.
- Pastoral system (including being a form tutor to a selected group of students)
- Teaching, ensuring a high quality learning experience for students

The successful candidate will:

- Hold QTS (or equivalent) and a relevant undergraduate degree
- Have successful teaching experience at secondary level (can be teaching practice), ideally including experience in working in an 11-18 school
- Understand the theory and practice of effective teaching and learning
- Understand the importance of high expectations and equality of access for all students, and of being a tutor
- Have knowledge of National Curriculum requirements at KS3 and KS4 and KS5 and of writing lesson plans, developing resources and assessing students' work.
- Be able to work as part of the Design team and to develop and maintain positive relationships with all staff.
- Have a good level of ICT skills, adaptable to teach CAD (Sketch up /2D Design) at KS3, KS4 and KS5.
- Be able to create a motivating and safe learning environment for all students across both the Design studios and Manufacturing area.

- Have good written and spoken communication skills
- Be able to lead and manage their own work effectively
- Have excellent time management skills




