This is an outstanding opportunity to join one of Oxfordshire's most successful schools. Wallingford School is a successful, oversubscribed, 8 form entry, mixed comprehensive Academy of over 1250 students aged 11-19, who come from Wallingford and its surrounding villages. We have an excellent reputation, enjoying strong support from parents and students, and a good and growing working relationship with the local community.

Examination outcomes are very strong indeed. At Key Stage 5 our figure of 65% of grades being either A\*, A or B was the highest of any state school Sixth Form in Oxfordshire in 2019 and our value-added score placed us once again within the top 20% of schools nationally. At Key Stage 4 our Progress 8 score was 0.31 with 61% of students attaining 5+ in both English and Maths and 24% 7+ in those subjects. In short, our students achieve highly during their time with us.

These results are great but our school is about much more than just exams. We are an inclusive school which – as the only secondary school in the town – is determined to serve its local community well. Comprehensive school values are important to us. Students of all abilities thrive at Wallingford and we pride ourselves on giving students a chance who may not have had one at other schools.

Staff – both teaching and associate – are happy at Wallingford. Professional development is important to us and our programme is varied but also bespoke to support individual needs and priorities. Our annual two-day Teaching and Learning Conference is probably the highlight of this programme. Student attitudes and behaviour are excellent and are frequently commented upon by visitors as being so. It is an excellent place to work and we are committed to staff wellbeing and a healthy work-life balance for all our colleagues.

### THE DT TEAM

The Design Technology Team is a group of strong and reflective teachers consistently delivering great results in all subjects at GCSE and those offered at A Level. It is no surprise that DT subjects at Wallingford are popular options. You would be joining a team of specialist teachers who show all round ability, experience and commitment.

The Design Technology rooms and workshops are grouped together in one main corridor which allows for a close and supportive working environment. The accommodation comprises of a Graphics room, two Resistant Materials workshops, a Textiles room, two Food rooms, an ICT suite, a materials preparation room and a purpose built Sixth Form room.

### **KS3**

KS3 students are taught in mixed-ability groups. We all follow a circus system in each year where students have approximately 8-10 weeks in CAD, Food, Graphics, Resistant Materials and Textiles. We use pupil-friendly assessment objectives for all major pieces of work in KS3.

### **GCSE**

At KS4 we follow AQA Specifications in Food, DT: Graphic Products, Art and Design Textiles, and OCR DT: Resistant Materials. DT has always been a popular choice within the school curriculum with many groups at GCSE.

### **A-Level**

At A level we follow OCR Product Design and AQA Art and Design Textiles, and Level 3 Food Science and Nutrition.
