Curriculum

English

At Key Stage 3, students enjoy a progressive curriculum that develops thematically, designed around key text forms and types of writing. In any given year, pupils are exposed to novels, short stories, plays, poetry, non-fiction and media texts. Through our curriculum, we aim to lessen the gap in students' cultural poverty, build their appreciation and love of reading, develop confidence to read critically across all texts and to write accurately, fluently, effectively for a range of purposes founded on secure linguistic and grammatical knowledge.

At Key Stage 4, students follow the Eduqas GCSE English Language specification and the AQA GCSE English Literature specification.

At Key Stage 5, we currently offer GCE A level Eduqas English Language and Literature and GCE A level Eduqas Film Studies. Our Sixth Form is expanding, and as it does we look to expand our offer in all subjects at Key Stage 5.

Drama

At Key Stage 3, our focus is to provide students with strong foundational skills through exploring drama through a range of practical, experiential and theoretical contexts. Students will study literature and media texts, engaging with them creatively through innovative devised pieces, and analytically through written responses and theatre reviews.

At Key Stage 4, all students follow the Eduqas GCSE Drama specification.
