The English department is a well-established and hugely successful team that delivers a range of curriculum opportunities throughout Key Stages 3 and 4. The department has access to mobile devices that connect to the school network via a wireless system. Peter Lowe-Werrell Headteacher English is an enriching and rewarding subject which we are passionate about here at Mary Webb School and Science College.

English is taught by 6 specialist teachers, each of whom has a broad and detailed knowledge of the subject.

Our aim is to develop critical, independent thinkers, who are able to express themselves confidently and accurately in all aspects of speaking, reading and writing.

We promote a creative and critical approach to reading and writing, fostering discussion and debate as well as securing high standards of writing and informed critical responses to reading.

Transition work is strong, primary feeder schools being given a class reader and activities which inform the work done in Year 7.

The KS3 curriculum has been redeveloped over recent years to reflect the requirements of the National Curriculum both in terms of writing for purpose and in the range and depth of study offered by units of work, including a study of the history of the English language and yearly work on aspects of Shakespeare and poetry. In Year 7 the department works closely with the Drama department to generate a cross-curricular approach to the study of Shakespeare's works.

The department sponsors and promotes a love of reading through the collective approaches to encouraging and monitoring the reading progress of its students. Regular use of the library and reading sessions at KS3 are supported with testing and assessment.

Where possible, visits from national and local authors, as well as trips to theatre productions, including Macbeth, A Christmas Carol and An Inspector Calls and 'Poetry Live' happen across the school year.

The successful candidate will be required to teach religious education and possibly geography at Key Stage 3. The humanities classrooms all have interactive boards and there are key texts and shared teaching resources developed by the department. The department places a high emphasis on literacy and supporting students to produce quality pieces of work. There are many enrichment activities that take place throughout the year including visits and school-based activities



The department is situated across a suite of five rooms close to the School Library. Each room is equipped with an interactive TV screen as well as the necessary audio equipment. The department has access to a bank of notebooks and the classroom-size suite of personal computers situated adjacent to the Library.

The department is well stocked with a range of texts from Shakespeare to modern texts for students. The department also provides reading boxes to the forms across the school for the purpose of whole form reading sessions during registration. The school has invested in better dictionaries and other resources to support the development of students' vocabulary.

Key Stage 3

Transition arrangements from Key Stage 2 to Key Stage 3 are exemplary in terms of continuity and knowledge of students' strengths and weaknesses as they arrive to begin the secondary curriculum. Students are taught in mixed ability groups of five classes per year group.

A redeveloped curriculum and assessment process ensures that students are better able to identify particular strengths and weaknesses across the disciplines of speaking and listening; reading and writing.

Assessments take place over the course of each half-term/unit of study and through formal examinations in year groups.

Key Stage 4

The students follow the new AQA 8700 specifications

for English Language and 8702 English Literature GCSE courses.

The teaching of the content of the course begins in Year 10.

Students are taught in mixed ability groups with five groups in Year 11 and five in Year 10. English Language and English Literature results are consistently strong over time.

Interventions in Year 11 take place during registration periods and after school on Tuesdays, and are well attended by students.

Regular assessments and thorough moderation of standards take place every half term; the speaking and

listening component being practised at the end of Year 9 and taken and moderated at the end of Year 10.

In humanities, courses follow the national curriculum. In Religious Education, the locally agreed syllabus is followed. Students have a range of experiences in their lessons and they are assessed in a variety of ways.

Information about the school

Mary Webb School and Science College is situated in a particularly beautiful location in the village of Pontesbury, just a few miles south of Shrewsbury. The site, surrounded by hills and woodland, provides an ideal setting for a school that aims to provide an educational experience firmly rooted in a modern rural context. We seek to open minds and widen horizons by ensuring that all our students are prepared for the challenges of life in the 21st century.

As a relatively small, community secondary school of over 700 students, staff and governors, we feel that the school has a number of distinctive features that makes it a little bit special. We aim to provide an environment in which each and every student can develop and flourish, and where the pursuit of excellence, in terms of personal development and academic achievement, is the aspiration of all. Relatively small class sizes ensures that every student receives personal attention.

The curriculum at Key Stage 4 is based around a core GCSE offer. We believe that this provides students with robust qualifications that support transition to post-16 education, training and employment. GCSE examination results at Mary Webb School and Science College have been good in recent years and are above national averages for attainment and progress across the curriculum.

GCSE results in 2023 saw 75% of our students achieving GCSEs in both English and mathematics at grade 4 and above. The school's Attainment 8 score was 48.33, which was higher than the Shropshire average for secondary schools. More than 11% of GCSEs awarded to our students were at grades 8 or 9. Most importantly, all our students were able to go on to the destinations they planned to in September 2023.
