### **The MFL Faculty**

The MFL Faculty comprises two full time teachers and four part time teachers. The Faculty has a good balance of experience and enthusiasm and an ambition among members to challenge students to the full potential of their ability. The subject leader is responsible for ensuring that non-specialists are confident in the delivery of these schemes; the dominant ethos being one of team work and co-operation. Schemes of work are provided for all year groups but also allow a degree of flexibility; colleagues are welcome to adapt and change these to incorporate their own ideas and share good practice

### **French and Spanish**

An enthusiastic Head of Department leads a committed, friendly and innovative team in its teaching. We have 6 dedicated MFL classrooms all of which are equipped with overhead projectors and whiteboards. Students learn French or Spanish from year 7 for four hours a fortnight. We usually have around 30% of year 9 students continuing with French or Spanish to GCSE and we will have a French and Spanish A level group next year. Students are performing well with both French and Spanish achieving some of the best results at GCSE – significantly above the national average.

We believe that learning a language is an essential part of a balanced, broad and relevant curriculum. We also think it is important to give students equal opportunities with students from other European countries. We are keen to offer students educational experiences beyond the classroom and have a close relationship with a school in Les Pieux. We also have strong links with a Spanish school in Jaen.
