Geography is the study of places and the relationships between people and their environments. From an educational perspective, as geography teachers we aim to enable students to apply knowledge and conceptual understanding to new settings: that is, to 'think geographically' about the changing world. The unique fusion of the physical and social sciences in geography, along with the way the subject relies on skills and knowledge developed in other subjects, make it important to identify the different albeit interconnected elements of the subject. We also run a number of external fieldwork opportunities such as a trip to Bakewell for Year 7, a residential fieldwork opportunity to Keswick for Year 10 Geographers and a day of urban and rural fieldwork for all Year 11 Geographers.
