CURRICULUM

In KS3 students are grouped according to their ability and they follow our Key Stage 3 syllabuses which include topics such as *Extreme Ecosystems*, *Our Divided World* and *Our Restless Earth*. At KS4 and 5 students are placed in mixed ability groups following AQA courses. These schemes of work are complementary to our KS3 and KS5 extends learning at KS4. Although the way in which we use the scheme of work is continually being adapted to reflect fieldwork choices and skills to help prepare students for the challenges of the new 2016 curriculum of which we started with our Year 9 in September.
