The History Department at Netherhall School is a highly popular and successful department, employing three full-time specialist teachers. The department is well resourced – each classroom is equipped with a desktop computer and data projector, while the department also makes use of the school’s IT rooms. The department has an extensive library of single copy resource books, as well as class set textbooks to support a wide range of worksheets and online resources that are used to support students’ learning. In recent years, the department has invested heavily in new GCSE and A level textbooks to ensure students are able to fully realise their potential under the new examination frameworks.

The department has a tradition of and a strong focus on differentiation, with different schemes of work and resources for each level of ability. The newly-revamped Key Stage 3 curriculum plan focuses on developing both knowledge and subject skills, with a strong focus on the development of extended writing and literacy in general.

History has always been a very popular GCSE option at Netherhall School and students have the opportunity to visit the battlefields of WW1 in France and Belgium during year 10. The department follows the AQA History specification at GCSE level. The key areas covered are:

Paper 1: Understanding the Modern World

Section A

- Germany 1890-1945: Democracy and Dictatorship.

Section B

- Conflict and Tension: The First World War, 1894-1918.



Paper 2: Shaping the Nation

Section A

- Britain: Health and the People c.1000 to the present day.

Section B

- Elizabethan England c.1568-1603.

The department consistently performs well in GCSE examinations, with excellent results being obtained by both boys and girls. In summer 2021, 72% of students achieved a grade 9-4, with 26% reaching grades 9-7. Many GCSE students continue their studies to A level, where the department has reached a consistently high standard over the years, most notably receiving the "Good School's Guide Gold Award" for the highest performing English Comprehensive School for girls taking History at AS level in 2015. In summer 2021, the department's results were rated at ALPS grade 1: "Outstanding", which helped to contribute to the school's overall "Outstanding" ALPS report; this placed Netherhall School in the top 1% of academic results from all sixth form providers in England.

- Britain 1930 – 1997.
- Germany 1919 – 1963.

Year 13

- Rebellion and Disorder under the Tudors, 1485-1603.
- Personal Study.
