The NCLT came into being on 1st October 2018. We are a cross-phase multi-academy trust comprising one secondary school (Sir James Smith's) and four primary schools (Camelford, Otterham, St Breward and St Teath). We are small rural schools with a history of working together. Governors were keen that accountability for our schools stayed local and decided that setting up our own MAT was the best way to protect our independence and safeguard our future. Our staff are determined to improve opportunities and outcomes for all children and believe that by working together we can raise standards. Colleagues in Sir Jim's are keen to learn from their primary colleagues and vice versa. By working together and basing that partnership on cooperative values, more can be achieved for students and their families, than can be achieved by schools working alone.

St Teath School


We are situated in the heart of the village of St Teath in North Cornwall and are a true community school in every sense of the word. We believe in embracing all aspects of the local community, participating in many village events, as well as inviting members of the community into our school to enhance the learning experiences of all of our children.

We have 4 classes from Reception to Year 6:

- Elm Class Reception
- Willow Class Year 1 and Year 2
- Sycamore Class Year 3 and Year 4
- Oak Class Year 5 and Year 6

The grounds have recently been developed to provide a range of opportunities for use throughout the curriculum. Our outdoor learning area is going from strength to strength, a range of play equipment is installed, new playground markings and seating areas are provided for children's use and enjoyment.








Otterham School

Otterham School has a warm, welcoming and inclusive ethos that children, parents, staff and visitors to the school feel and comment upon. The school is a happy place to be with children who have a 'growth mind-set' (Primary Futures feedback 2019).

The curriculum has been created with reading and a love of books at its heart (The Power of Reading) and with the mission to provide breadth and balance in all subjects. Enrichment plays an important part in a child's journey through Otterham School with a wide variety of experiences provided through trips, visitors, clubs and residential stays from Y1 upwards. The ultimate aim is to educate the whole child, developing confidence, independence and self-esteem, preparing them for their next steps.

Otterham School has a strong emphasis on learning outside, delivered by an Outdoor Learning Leader. This provides memorable learning experiences for the children, ownership over their environment and possibly most importantly, assists with positive emotional wellbeing. Children particularly enjoy the enterprise element of growing produce to price, package and sell to parents from the market stall at the end of the school day. Den building, outdoor cookery, chicken husbandry, woodwork and maze making enhance their learning experiences and add to their levels of enjoyment.







Camelford Primary School

There is something very special about Camelford and we are incredibly proud of the place 'where every person matters!'

At Camelford, we strive to ensure that every child achieves their full potential and is prepared for the next phase of their education. We are driven to ensure that we teach our children the value of our community, the environment, each other and learning. 






Sir James Smith's School

Sir James Smith's is one of the smaller comprehensive schools in Cornwall. It is situated within a large rural catchment with approximately 70% of students travelling daily by bus. Student numbers are increasing over the next 3 – 5 years and we will ensure the school continues to provide the very best experience for both students and parents/carers. Being a small school, one of its strengths is the relationship built between staff and students. This is a school where all staff know each other well and take a collaborative approach to supporting wellbeing and professional development. Surveys such as the Pupil Attitude to School and Self repeatedly indicate students feel safe and have a healthy respect for their teachers, they like coming to school. Last inspected in 2016 when the school secured a 'Good' judgement, it is currently into the third year of a five year plan to be judged 'Outstanding',
