Our school is popular and over subscribed because of our reputation for innovation and achievement. We have 1100 full time students, and ambitions to expand our community provision.

We consider this post to be an outstanding opportunity to work within a supportive school, and excellent humanities departments, which value creativity and imaginative teaching and learning approaches. We operate an open management structure and everyone participates in many of the key discussions for our future.

The staff team, both whole school and within our humanties subjects, is high performing, supportive and very open to innovation and development. History, geography and religious studies are taught as discrete subjects in KS3, KS4 and KS5. This is essential in allowing us to deliver a broad and balanced curriculum. We are looking to appoint a teacher who is a specialist in either history or religious studies but would be equipped to teach both subjects.

We can offer successful applicants teaching rooms that are well equipped and all members of staff are supplied with a laptop. The departmental offices have desks and storage space for teachers.

We teach history for two hours a week in key stage 3, and broadly follow the National Curriculum to ensure a broad and balanced provision of different topics, themes, and time periods. At GCSE we follow the Edexcel specification, teaching units on Crime and Punishment, Elizabethan England, the American West and Weimar and Nazi Germany. In Year 7 students are taught in mixed ability groups, while in Year 8 there is more opportunity for setting based on achievement. In key stage 4 classes are all mixed ability. History is a popular subject for A-level, and we currently teach units on the Early Stuarts, Fascist Italy, and American Civil Rights. Students are also guided through their coursework, which is on a topic of their choice. We organise frequent opportunities for extra-curricular educational visits both to local sites of interest but also further afield: the school currently runs popular educational visits to the Belgian battlefields in Year 8, and to Rome in Years 12/13. The department is extremely well-resourced with lesson plans, schemes of work and textbooks for all key stages, and has a highly collaborative working ethos.

The Religious Studies department consists of an experienced, supportive and high performing team. Thorough lesson plans and resources are provided for all key stages, although we are always open to innovation and development. We teach all students in Key Stages 3 and 4 with the majority of Year 11 students taking a GCSE in the subject. We also offer Religious Studies at A level. All examined courses achieve excellent outcomes. The Religious Studies Department has a good reputation within the school and is well respected by our students.
