To integrate literacy, numeracy, SMSC and safeguarding into teaching and learning.• To make effective use of assessment information to inform planning and maximise pupil progress• To provide regular and effective feedback to pupils which helps improve learning, including classwork and homework, providing constructive oral and written feedback and setting appropriate targets to maximise pupils' progress• To provide accurate and informative reports to parents during the year, including meeting with parents at Parents' Evening• To ensure that pupils with SEND and those who are disadvantaged are fully supported in lessons ensuring they can make maximum progress.• To evaluate their own teaching critically and to use this to improve their effectiveness• To attend and contribute fully to meetings and Parents' Evenings as required and participate fully in CPD programmes• To contribute to activities identified in the Faculty Improvement Plan and be a supportive member of the Faculty team• To carry out the role and responsibilities of a form tutor• To contribute to the planning and delivery of wider curricular activities
