- Carrying out formative and summative assessment, giving students clear and constructive feedback in line with the school Assessment Policy and statutory reporting requirements for parents.
- Aim to ensure that students achieve well relative to their prior attainment, making progress as good as or better than similar students nationally and in the school.
- To work with the history department and colleagues across trust on curriculum development and sharing of best practice.

- Assume responsibility for a tutor group.
