Ruskin's Mathematics Department is a large and thriving team that enjoys impressive facilities for this well regarded subject spanning Key Stage 3 – 5. The department occupies a dedicated teaching block within the Academy; it is well resourced and benefits from high quality accommodation and staff facilities.

The department's philosophy is that Mathematics is a creative and highly interconnected discipline that is essential to everyday life, critical to Science, Technology and Engineering, and necessary for financial literacy and most forms of employment. A high-quality Mathematics education provides a foundation for understanding the world, the ability to reason mathematically, an appreciation of the beauty and power of Mathematics, and a sense of enjoyment and curiosity about the subject.
