<p>Child Protection:</p>	<p>Our policy applies to all staff, governors and volunteers working at Bohunt. We ensure that these approaches are consistent with other educational providers who work with our students.
<p>Teaching:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To teach, students according to their education needs, including the regular setting and marking of work to be carried out by the student in School and beyond • To assess, record and report on the attendance, progress, development and attainment of students and to keep such record as are required • To provide, or contribute to, oral and written assessments, reports and references relating to individual students and group of students • To undertake a designated programme of teaching • To ensure a high quality learning experience for all students which meets school expectations • To prepare and update subject materials • To use a variety of teaching methods which will stimulate learning appropriate to student needs and demands of the syllabus • To maintain discipline in accordance with School procedures and to encourage good practice with regard to punctuality, behaviour and standards of work • To undertake assessment of students as requested by external examination bodies, departmental and School procedures • To mark, grade and give written/verbal and diagnostic, next steps feedback as required in line with School Assessment Policy
