As a school, we are committed to continuous improvement so that we can continue to evolve to match the changing needs of our students, parents and carers, staff and wider school community. We are keen to utilise the latest thinking and technologies to ensure all our students are best equipped to achieve success in the future.

Our governors and staff are fully committed to serving the needs of our school community in these challenging social times, including continuing to develop the very strong academic performance of our school. Littleover Community School is an 11-18 comprehensive, community school. We are a Local Authority maintained school and have a positive working relationship with Derby City Council.

Our school is situated four miles to the south west of the centre of Derby, in pleasant, spacious grounds. We have a proud academic and pastoral record and the school is always popular with parents and carers looking for school places, within our own catchment area and beyond.

We currently welcome 295 students into Year 7 each year, giving us a current roll of approximately 1850, including a Sixth form of over 350 students.

#### Student outcomes

We are proud of our students' attainment and progress: Littleover Community School students consistently perform above local and national averages.

#### Summer 2023 headlines:

- Key Stage 4 Progress 8 +0.54
- 40% of students achieved 3 or more GCSE grades 7-9
- A Level average grade B+

Last year, our Year 11 students achieved the highest Progress 8 score of any school in Derby or Derbyshire.

As an inclusive school, we particularly value this measure as it reflects the progress made by every child regardless of their starting point.

#### Ofsted

The school was inspected in October 2022 and was judged as 'Good' in all areas with 'Outstanding' Sixth Form provision.

"Leaders have high expectations. They have created an inclusive and academic culture. Leaders ensure that all pupils, including pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND), achieve well. Leaders help pupils prepare for next steps in their education. Pupils and sixth-form students leave school with the skills and knowledge they need to thrive.

Pupils' behaviour in lessons is calm and focused. They are eager to share their ideas and knowledge. The vast majority of pupils do not worry about bullying. If they had any concerns, they would report them to staff. Leaders are quick to respond to concerns. The 'LCS Way' helps to create a caring and purposeful culture.

Students in the sixth form experience a welcoming and respectful environment. One student said that attending the sixth form has helped them to develop their identity. Students value the support their teachers provide and the sense of community they share with their peers.

Leaders provide pupils with personal development opportunities. These include the Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme as well as sports, arts and music clubs. Some pupils access games club and craft club. Students in the sixth form join in with enrichment activities. These include pottery classes, learning British Sign Language and a debating society.

Leaders are ambitious about what they want pupils to learn. Sequences of lessons cover a broad range of knowledge. Leaders have ensured that teachers know which knowledge to teach and in what order. This helps pupils to develop their understanding of the subjects they study. Sixth-form students are very knowledgeable and make connections between current and prior learning."

### Language Hub Status

Littleover Community School is one of just 15 schools nationally to have been awarded Phase 1 Language Hub status. We are the home of Derwent Language Hub, a beacon of good practice for Languages teaching across the East Midlands.

The school is working with six local Partner Schools to develop the teaching of French, German, and Spanish across Derby city. The focus is increasing both the uptake of Languages at GCSE as well as raising the attainment of students who sit these qualifications.

The Maths Department consists of 14 dedicated members of staff, including the Maths Co-ordinator, Deputy Co-ordinator and two other posts of responsibility. We also have one specialist HLTA within the department.

Maths is taught in a suite of 10 rooms in the main building.

We are proud of our achievements and success in public exams. Our students consistently achieve excellent GCSE results. In 2023 84% of students achieved grades 9-4, and 32% grades 9-7. A Level Maths is a very popular choice with approximately 160 students currently studying Maths, including 2 Further Maths groups. Again, results are consistently high, with 70% of students achieving A\*-B and we are always keen to further improve and have set some ambitious targets for the future.

The Maths Department has regularly worked collaboratively with other schools, including local primary schools. We support The University of Nottingham and Nottingham Trent University's PGCE courses and regularly offer prospective teachers placements within the department.

#### **Grouping of Students**

**Year 7, 8 and 9:** Students are set by ability during the first half term in Year 7 and follow a bespoke scheme of work throughout KS3 designed to prepare them for the demands of GCSE Mathematics whilst ensuring they are engaged, enthused and enriched in their studies.

**Year 10 and 11:** Students are split into 6 sets in each half year group following the AQA Linear Course (8300). Students in Set 1 also study for the Level 2 Certificate in Further Mathematics to deepen their knowledge and prepare for A-level.

**Years 12 and 13:** AQA A-level Maths. Maths is a popular A Level choice with 10 Maths groups over the 2 years including a Further Maths group in each year.

#### Resources

The department has a wide range of textbooks for staff to use across all key stages. All students in KS5 have a textbook to take home and use for the duration of the course.

Amongst the online resources we subscribe to are Mathsbox and Mathswatch for KS3 and 4 and Integral Maths for KS5 with all students having their own logins.

We have the sole use of a networked PC room with 32 machines. All classes have the opportunity to use this facility. Most have one lesson per fortnight in the computer room.

There is a wide variety of prepared files to use in ICT lessons with the above packages and Excel on the network. The department has a class set of Casio graphic calculators for use in lessons. All rooms have interactive SMART boards installed with desktop PC access and a visualizer.

#### **Extra-curricular activities**

- A number of Year 11 students attend a Maths 'Sunrise Club' run weekly by volunteers before school.
- Top set students in Year 7-10, and some Year 12 and 13 students, enter the UK Maths Challenge each year, with several students receiving Gold and other certificates.
- The school enters a team for the UKMT Senior Team Challenge (Year 12 and 13).
- There is a weekly tutorial after school, run by the department to support Year 12 and 13 students.
