LEADERSHIP

1. Support curriculum implementation through the production and quality assurance of shared resources in Maths
2. To lead the development of appropriate specifications, resources, medium term plans and long-term plans in KS3 Maths
3. To support the HOF and KS3 Assessment and Data lead in monitoring and following up student progress in KS3 Maths
4. To support with setting/ grouping decisions at KS3
5. To work with the KS3 Assessment and Data lead to ensure that all assessments are fit for purpose
6. To support the Head of Faculty with developing actions following QA activities in Maths as required
7. To support and mentor trainees, Teach First participants and ECTs

as required in Maths

8. To lead on specific areas of curriculum development work in Maths as directed by Head of Faculty
9. To work with Head of Faculty and SLMT curriculum liaison to plan and deliver subject CPD
10. Take an active role in the Maths management team to provide pedagogical guidance to support curriculum development
11. Actively engage with current educational research and disseminate this to the faculty.
12. Attend and contribute to faculty and management team meetings
13. Plan and prepare lessons to teach classes across the age and ability range (KS3 and 4)
14. Teach students according to their educational needs, including the planning and assessment of work carried out by the student in school and elsewhere
15. Communicate effectively and professionally with parents and carers on student progress and welfare, after consultation with appropriate staff
16. Liaise with pastoral leaders to ensure the implementation of the school's pastoral system, including the identification of any perceived student difficulties and possible resolutions
17. Register students, accompany them to assemblies, encourage their full attendance at all lessons and their participation in other aspects of school life
18. Assist in the implementation of the Behaviour for Learning policy and the Five Respects so that effective learning can take place, including high expectations in respect of punctuality, standards of classwork and home learning
19. Share in the management of the behaviour of students including the break duty rota
20. Maintain appropriate records and provide relevant accurate and up-to-date information for Management Information Systems (MIS), registers, etc.
21. Complete the relevant documentation for the tracking of students and to track student progress to inform teaching and learning and report to parents.
22. Take part in marketing and liaison activities such as Open Evenings, Parents Evenings and liaison events with partner schools
23. Contribute to Personal Development according to the school policy
24. Assess, record and report on student attendance, progress, development and attainment
25. Undertake assessment of students as requested by external

- examination bodies, departmental and school procedures
26. Mark, grade and give high quality feedback in line with whole school and faculty expectations
 27. Assist the Head of Faculty and School Leadership and Management Team to establish, monitor, evaluate and develop Learning and Teaching and the curriculum
 28. Take part, as required, in the review, development and management of activities relating to the curriculum, organisation and pastoral functions of the school

29. Ensure mapping of the KS3 Maths curriculum fits the national curriculum and is well sequenced
30. Ensure the KS3 Maths Curriculum is ambitious and allows access for all students
31. Ensure Medium Term Plans are detailed and fit for purpose at KS3
32. Ensure resources are in place for staff to use and updated for all ability groups on a rolling cycle
33. Liaise with the data lead to produce and contribute to QLAs for KS3
34. To lead on the organisation and provision of cover for KS3 classes when colleagues are absent
35. Provide updates for the faculty of exam resources and changes to meet the need of the students, examining and awarding bodies and the schools aims
36. Share in the management and development of consistent pedagogy
37. To be the Literacy lead for KS3 Maths
38. Act as a role model demonstrating the culture, expectations and ethos of the Radclyffe School.
39. Support the Maths management team to ensure that Maths policy and practice continues to be well aligned with the whole school aims.

PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND CONDUCT

40. Actively engage in the school's Appraisal process.
41. Take part in the school's staff development programme by participating in arrangements for further training and professional development
42. Lead by example and promote and enable team work in pursuit of corporate excellence
