Main features of the department

There are ten full-time members of the maths department and three part-time colleagues.

The department is located in a suite of rooms in the school's Kennion building. At present, Y7 students are taught in mixed ability classes. Years 8, 9, 10 and 11 are grouped based on ability.

GCSE students follow the EdExcel linear syllabus. Work is based around a variety of resources according to student needs.

Examination results are consistently high with 82 per cent of all students entered in 2025 gaining a GCSE grade 4 or above. The P8 score for maths in 2024 was 0.24.

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Extensive student interviews suggest that the vast majority recognise the importance of maths and want to succeed in this area.

A level maths in the Sixth Form is very popular with at least two groups in each year and a further maths group.

More than 45% of A Level maths students in the last four years have attained a grade A* - A; more than 45% of further maths students in the last four years achieved A* - A.
