<b>Reporting to</b>	Head of Maths, Deputy Headteacher responsible for Quality of Education, Headteacher
<b>Main purpose of job</b>	To Teach Maths at Key Stages 3 and 4, working as a member of the Maths team and demonstrating good practice in raising standards of achievement
<b>Key responsibilities:</b>	
To teach Maths throughout the school, working as a member of the Maths team under the direction of the Head of Department. Teaching at Key Stage 3 and 4 which includes a contribution to the Numeracy Strategy.	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• You will work closely with the Head of Maths in all professional matters to develop schemes of work that are differentiated;</li><li>• You will ensure that there are effective teaching strategies to give access to the curriculum for all pupils;</li><li>• You will monitor and improve the quality of teaching and learning; set targets and plan for improvement, development and enrichment.</li><li>• Take responsibility for organisational and administrative tasks related to your work and carry out tasks efficiently and within the deadlines set.</li><li>• Undertake appropriate pastoral and tutorial roles including being a tutor or partner tutor and teaching PSHE.</li><li>• Share in the general responsibility for the academic, social, personal and cultural development of pupils.</li></ul>	
In addition to carrying out the duties of a classroom teacher the person appointed will:	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Work closely with the Head of Maths, the Deputy Head of Department and KS3 and KS4 Co-ordinators on the overall management and development of the department's work.</li><li>2. Take responsibility, in collaboration with the Key Stage 3 and 4 Co-ordinator and the Head of Maths, for an agreed area of the department development plan.</li><li>3. Examples of specific responsibilities which could be included are:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Working collaboratively on KS3 or KS4 developments.</li><li>• Supporting the use of data and monitoring progress.</li></ul></li></ol>	

- Working with a Teach first trainee or NQT.
- Developing cross curricular initiatives.
- Monitoring achievement of SEN or vulnerable children.
- Developing functional skills.

4. Act as a subject mentor and contribute to the induction and training of new staff and trainee teachers as requested.
