- Enthusiasm for innovation in curriculum and assessment.

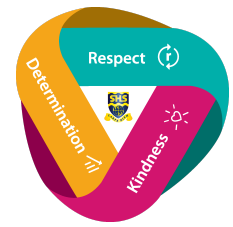
