OUR EXCITING AND CHALLENGING CURRICULUM

At Furze Platt we recognise that students are motivated and achieve well when they have an exciting range of rigorous and challenging subjects to study. Our curriculum is broad and rich at Key Stage 3, and allows increasing specialisation and choice at Key Stages 4 and 5.

Key Stage 3 – Years 7-9

In Key Stage 3 students take a wide range of subjects including English, Maths, three Sciences, three separate Humanities subjects, PE, Computing and IT, Art, Design Technology, Food and Nutrition, Drama, Dance and Music. In addition, all students take French, as well as either Spanish or German. This broad and exciting curriculum gives them an excellent foundation for taking their GCSE subjects from Year 10 onwards.

Key Stage 4 - Years 10 and 11

In Key Stage 4 students take GCSEs in English Language and Literature and Maths. Students choose between three separate Science qualifications (Biology, Physics and Chemistry), and 'Combined' Science, which counts for two qualifications. Students then take four further subjects, from a wide choice including two different Computing and ICT qualifications, three different Humanities subjects, all three languages, and Business Studies. Additionally, we offer



a wide variety of practical and creative subjects, including Music, Dance, Drama, Art, Product Design, Food and Nutrition, along with four vocational subjects – Child Development, Travel and Tourism, Construction and Health and Fitness.

Key Stage 5 - Years 12 and 13

The significant majority of students continue their studies in the Sixth Form. In Years 12 and 13 students choose from over 30 different courses across three different pathways.

THE WIDER CURRICULUM AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

For many at Furze Platt, the school day ends not at 3.15 but nearer 5pm. Each week over 50 extra-curricular activities are on offer. These include an array of music groups, from boys' choirs to percussion, from ukulele band to full orchestra, and culminate in concerts held throughout the year. The quality of extra-curricular drama is similarly exceptional, with many after school performances for students of all years, plus the annual school musical. The school is rightly proud of its sporting success, with football, rugby, hockey and netball practice and matches in the winter, and athletics and tennis in the summer, while students benefit from the stunning Furze Platt Leisure Centre facilities until 4.30pm each day. Students can also attend one of the cooking and baking clubs or one of the subjectbased revision classes.

Each May and June Year 7 students have the opportunity to spend three days at Osmington Bay in Dorset, learning skills, making friends, and showing kindness and consideration to those around them. The school also runs a major programme of evening, day and residential trips in Britain and abroad. These include theatre visits, Geography and History fieldwork visits, and Biology and Geography research visits to Nettlecombe in Somerset. Furze Platt students also enjoy ski trips to Italy, battlefield tours to France and Belgium, language visits to France, Germany and Spain, and still more adventurous tours to Iceland, Mexico. Indonesia and Borneo. Parental income is no barrier; where appropriate the school funds or subsidises educational visits to ensure that all can benefit.

GIFTED AND TALENTED PROVISION AND OPPORTUNITIES

Furze Platt has a very significant number of highly able students. Their aspirations are to join the ranks of Furze Platt alumni and attend Oxbridge or Russell Group universities, and to embark upon the most challenging careers, including engineering, medicine, law, dentistry, computing and veterinary science. Our very able students benefit, as do all students, from top-quality teaching. Significantly more students gain the top grade 9 in English and Maths GCSE at Furze Platt than do nationally, while a third of students gain A/A* at A-Level. The school runs a wide range of extra-curricular challenges and events for the most able, including Psychology GCSE which students take in Year 9, after-school Chinese classes, entry to the Maths Olympiad and Linguistics Olympiad, attendance at regional and national Science and Maths challenges, as well as national poetry competitions.

Students with sporting, musical, theatrical and other talents are also particularly well catered for at Furze Platt. The school is especially strong in tennis, rowing, football and, more recently, swimming, and students regularly continue their chosen sport either at university in Britain or the US, or professionally. Many students also combine school study with participation in amateur or professional regional and local productions. These talented students are supported through strong school-home partnerships and regular mentoring from teaching and other staff.









SUPPORT AND CARE AT FURZE PLATT

This is a kind and caring school. We know that sometimes the journey from primary school to secondary school can seem daunting, so we do everything we can to ease that transition. We meet Year 6 students and their teachers in their primary schools and we have transition days in July, along with an induction day in September. Our students spend the first 25 minutes of each day in mixed-age 'vertical' tutor groups, where older students help and mentor younger students. And all students are members of one of our eight houses, named after towns on the Thames. Year 7 students are taught some of their lessons by their Head of House, ensuring that our new students are instantly known well. The house system develops the Furze Platt values of aspiration, motivation, confidence and consideration. Students participate in regular house

challenges, from rowing to fitness, cooking to flag naming, spelling bees to countdown. These foster pride in the house and school, and encourage students to work with and support each other.

We are also exceptionally proud of the diversity of our students. We recognise that some will find lessons challenging, and have a comprehensive support programme including a highly successful catch-up reading programme, and highly-trained learning support assistants who help break down barriers to students' learning. We are proud to host the Royal Borough's service for supporting autistic students, and recognise the great contributions that our autistic students bring to our community and our lessons.

The school has a particularly strong partnership with John Lewis, who provide business talks, internships, and for students from Years 9-13 and this provides further training days for students at GCSE level and in the Sixth



FACILITIES AND RESOURCES


We know that students are more motivated and enjoy their studies more when they have an excellent learning environment. Furze Platt students are perhaps uniquely fortunate in the high-quality facilities and resources they enjoy. Over the past decade the following new additions have been made to the school: a purpose-built Maths block, state of the art Drama theatre and adjoining rehearsal studio, professional standard, floodlit Astroturf, three new, floodlit tennis / netball courts, and the enviable Furze Platt Leisure Centre, which the school has exclusive use of until 4.30pm. The Computing centre and the Sixth Form centre have been fully refurbished as has the Music centre, which now houses a separate professional-standard recording studio. In the last year we have also been fortunate to open a new three-storey teaching block incorporating Science laboratories and English classrooms. In autumn 2020 we will finish our new theatre which will stage performances and events for audiences of over four hundred.


Our recent alumni include:


