Modern Foreign Languages is seen as a key part of our curriculum at all Key Stages. Development in this area is a whole school focus and we are striving to drive the department forward quickly. Accommodation and facilities

The Modern Foreign Languages Department is accommodated in a suite of 4 rooms, each having a computer and data projectors. There is also a department office which can be used for speaking exams. The school's well-equipped library is adjacent to the Department and other computer suites are available for use. Interactive white boards are available, with two permanently installed in two rooms. The department has a good stock of up-to-date text books and excellent shared resources are on the school network. Investment has been made in *Kerboodle* online resources to support the delivery of the MFL specifications for GCSE and A-level. We are also continuing to build up our KS3, 4 and 5 Spanish resources.

What do students learn?

On joining Abbeyfield School in year 7 students learn French and Spanish. They follow these languages through KS3 and 4 (if selected as one of their optional subjects). We currently offer A-Levels in French and Spanish. We also assist students of other languages to be entered for examinations, such as in Mandarin or Polish, however these are not currently taught.

We are a hard working department and we have high expectations of our students and ourselves. We highly value extra curricular activities to support language learning and believe that creativity and fun are an important part of successful language teaching.
