We are lucky enough to have the best facilities in the local area, including a full size 3G pitch, Sports Hall, Gym, Dance Studio, Outdoor Gym, MUGA, Netball/Tennis Courts, Skatepark, Athletics Facilities and extensive grass fields, with an artificial Cricket wicket due to be built in April 2023 and further plans for expanding facilities in the future.

At Key Stage 3, we follow a curriculum that allows us to make the most of our fantastic facilities as well giving students a well-rounded education in a range of sports through a holistic approach to PE.
