

Faculty Information Science Faculty



At Ashby School we have a passion for learning.

All students are given every opportunity to achieve their academic potential, supported by high standards of teaching in a stimulating and creative learning environment.

The Science faculty is a very high performing faculty and is proud of its success within the school. Staff have high expectations of students and students enjoy their experience at both GCSE and A-Level.

Our GCSE results are consistently and significantly above national averages and this is down to the collaborative approach employed by the faculty in delivering high quality lessons and preparing our students for their exams. Running parallel with the core content lessons, we have created a separate independent scheme of work that develops our students' science skills and consolidates the content covered in Year 10.

We have separate prep rooms for each of the three sciences with specific, experienced technicians, and a faculty admin support. Most of our students follow the AQA trilogy specification across 20 sets in three tiers with 90 students following AQA separate sciences. The large number of students who continue to study science at A level is down to our success at GCSE. Currently we have nearly 400 students studying at KS5 and teach them on a dedicated sixth form campus.

We are a large, welcoming, social and supportive faculty with fantastic opportunities to develop your career both within and outside of the faculty.

- Support the tutorial system as required.


Key Responsibilities
