Key Stage 5

We teach AQA specification for Psychology and Sociology, and WJEC for Criminology. All students sit exams at the end of Year13 with no entries made in Year 12 for the A Levels. We follow the pathway set down by WJEC for the criminology controlled assessments and examinations.

We also offer BTEC Level 3 National Extended Certificate in Children's Play, Learning & Development; BTEC Extended Certificate in Health and Social Care; BTEC National Diploma in Heath & Social Care as well as NCFE CACHE Level 2 Diploma for the Early Years Practitioner.

Key Stage 4

We currently offer the BTEC Level 1/2 Tech Award in Health & Social Care.
