Purpose:

Responsible to: In the first instance the Head of Psychology and ultimately to the Headteacher.

Main responsibilities:

- Plan and deliver lessons that effectively implement the school's curriculum.
- Adapt lessons to ensure no student is left behind including those with SEND, EAL and disadvantaged students.
- Develop new teaching materials, schemes of learning and assessments as necessary.
- Follow the school's Behaviour Principles and Procedures Policy to ensure an excellent climate for learning is maintained at all times.
- Work closely with the SEND team to meet the needs of students with SEND and deploy classroom support effectively.
- Identify gaps in students' knowledge and skills through assessment strategies and adapt lessons as necessary.
- Assess students' knowledge, skills and curriculum progress and provide effective feedback in line with the School's Assessment, Feedback and Reporting Policy.
- Communicate with parents when necessary on progress or behaviour.
- Submit class data to the School's MIS in line with the Assessment, Feedback and Reporting Policy and reporting calendar.
- Take part in after school events such as Open Evening, Parents' Evenings, Sixth Form Open Evening.
- Ensure subject and pedagogical knowledge is up to date and regularly reviewed.
- Take active control of your own CPD programme and attend in school CPD as set out in the training calendar.
- Participate in arrangements for teacher appraisals.
- Assist with quality assurance and reviews as necessary.
- Support colleagues in and across teams.
- Identify ways to work more efficiently while maintaining high standards.
- Follow Keeping Children Safe in Education and report safeguarding concerns in line with the School's Safeguarding Policy.
- Undertake activities within the Department as the Head of Department may reasonably require.

Additional duties:

- Take on responsibility for a Tutor Group.
- Comply with the School's Health and Safety Policy.
- Undertake a break time duty as directed.
- Ensure the school site is calm and orderly during the school day.
- Other activies the Headteacher may reasonably require.
