The Vacancy:

The Religious Studies Department is part of the Society in Action Faculty. Religious Studies has only been taught as a stand-alone subject for the last two years. It is now a compulsory subject for all students from Year 7 through to the end of Year 10, when early entry GCSE is planned to take place. Currently pupils receive an hour a week at Year 7 and Year 8 and once the subject rolls through, pupils will receive two hours per week at Year 9 and Year 10.

You will be joining the department at an exciting time and this position is fundamental to supporting the establishment of the subject as one of the core aspects of the curriculum. The school, Governors and Diocese have high aspirations for the development of this subject and the impact that it will have on the wider community.
