# The Science Learning Area

The Science Learning Area includes the departments for Biology, Chemistry and Physics. These departments help facilitate the delivery of our KS3 Science course and the Combined Trilogy and Separate Science courses. Other subjects taught within the learning area include BTEC Health & Social Care and GCSE Electronics.

The Science Learning Area employs twelve science teachers. Responsibility for the learning area is shared between the Head of Learning Area [HOLA], the Heads of Department (for KS3 Science, Biology, Chemistry and Physics), a second in department (who is also a HoD) and several other members of the team. The learning area is well resourced with 5 laboratories. These have interactive whiteboards and visualisers. Separate Science achieved a VA of above 1 for each subject in 2018/2019, and Combined Trilogy achieved a VA of 0.6. The expectation is that this will increase significantly over the coming years.

This is an exciting time to join an excellent team; which will also provide opportunities to grow and develop within a strong team of committed Science specialists. We provide a positive and optimistic working environment focused on student progress.
