St Clement Danes School

St Clement Danes is an oversubscribed, highly regarded school situated in Chorleywood on the border between Hertfordshire and Buckinghamshire. It has been led by Toby Sutherland since January 2018, when the previous Headteacher, Dr Josephine Valentine OBE, became CEO of the Danes Educational Trust. With over 1000 applicants for 240 places annually, it is a popular local choice. It is partially selective, allocating 10% of places based on musical aptitude and 10% on the basis of an academic test coordinated through a local consortium of schools. This allows some students to gain places who do not live in the immediate vicinity of the school; however, the majority of students live in close proximity. When last visited by Ofsted, it was awarded outstanding in every one of the then 31 measures. Since then, it has more recently been awarded 'World Class School' status, an accolade awarded to schools who have moved 'beyond outstanding' and currently only held by a small number of schools nationwide. In 2016, it was one of the very first schools to be awarded Platinum Science Mark in recognition of its excellence in science teaching. It has a proud history dating back to 1862 and celebrates an annual Commemoration Service in St Clement Danes Church in the Strand.

The school regularly appears in lists of the top comprehensive schools in the country. During the tenure of the former Headteacher, outcomes at all levels improved significantly, with cohorts of students whose ability on entry at Key Stage 2 has remained broadly similar. In 1999, 59% of students achieved 5A*- C at GCSE; in 2019, 70% achieved grade 5 or above in English and Maths. In particular, it prides itself on the progress of its students. In 2019, the Progress 8 measure was +0.48. It is far from being complacent about its success; instead, it is a reflective, innovative, outward looking school which embraces change. There is plenty of scope for the successful candidates to help move the school forward; ensuring that St Clement Danes is consistently 'beyond outstanding' and maintains its outcomes in an ever changing educational landscape is a challenge which excites all members staff.



The Science Faculty

The Science Faculty at St Clement Danes is energetic, hard-working and high-performing: it values professionalism and challenge. Consisting of 16 teachers including a Head of Faculty, Subject Leaders of Biology, Chemistry, and Physics, a Key Stage 3 Co-ordinator, two Specialist Leaders in Education, and 3 Science Technicians, the Faculty has a broad range of experience and backgrounds, making for a supportive and aspirational professional atmosphere.

Student Outcomes

Students achieve outstanding outcomes in Science. In 2019, 94% of combined science students achieved a grade 4 or above. In separate sciences this was higher: 99% in Biology, 100% in Chemistry, 100% in Computer Science and 99% in Physics. The Faculty consistently performs in the top quintile of value-added performance in Science GCSE. The success continues at KS5: in 2019, 64% of students achieved A*-B in Biology, 55% in Chemistry and 55% in Physics.

Curriculum

The Faculty prides itself on offering a stimulating and aspirational curriculum at all Key Stages. At KS3, students are taught Science initially in mixed-ability groups (Year 7) and thereafter in sets (Years 8 and 9). The Activate scheme of learning is in place across Year 7 & 8, in year 9 students focus on key concepts and scientific skills. Students study the AQA GCSE specification either combined or separate Science. At KS4, approximately a third of the year group elect to study Separate Science GCSE with the rest of the cohort studying Combined Science.

Facilities

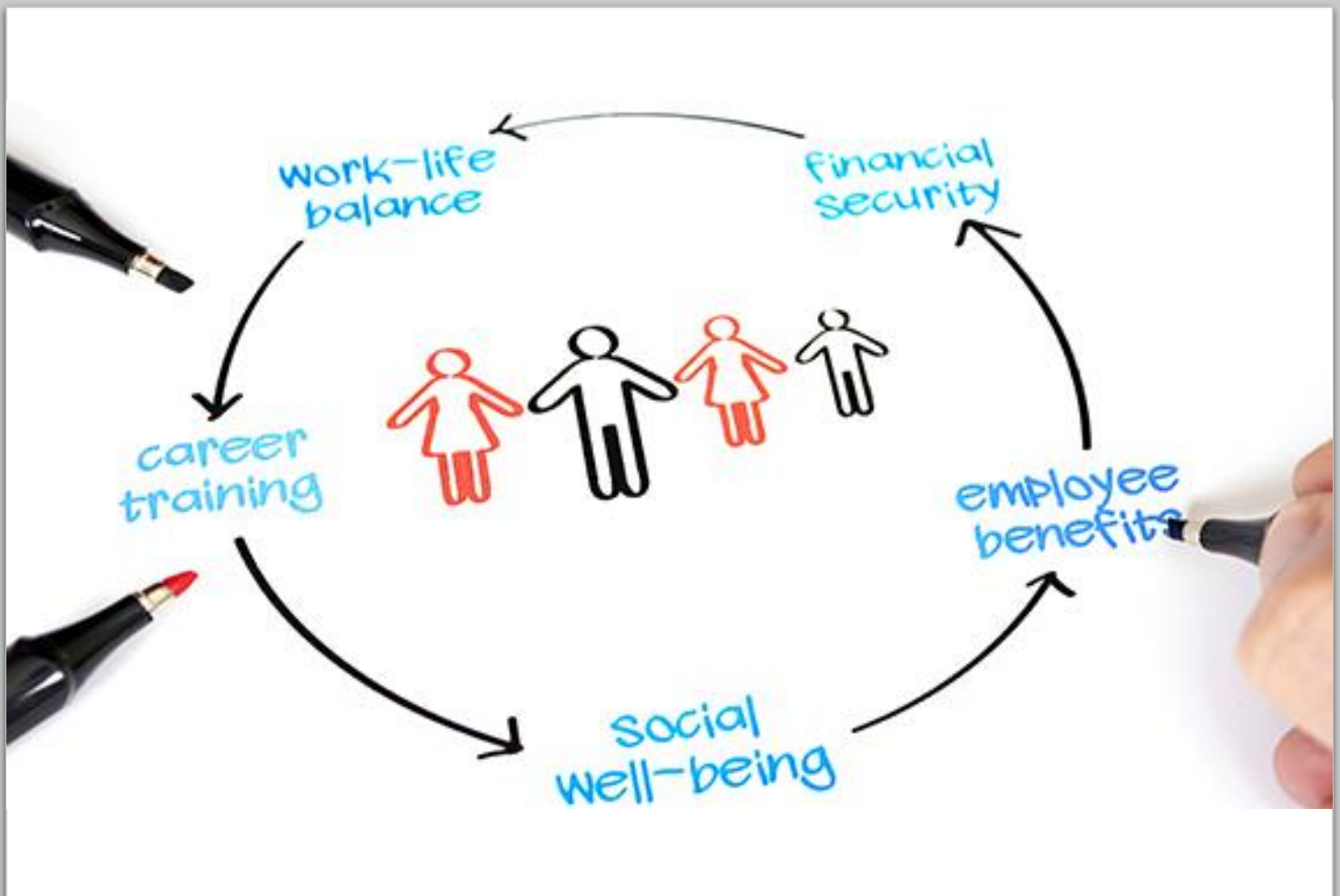
The Faculty comprises 11 laboratories, all of which are equipped to a high standard, alongside a preparation room and a staff workroom for teachers of Science. Each laboratory is fitted with an LED projector linked to a PC and an interactive whiteboard. A highly professional team of technicians works to support staff and students in practical enquiry.

Extra-curricular

The STEM Club (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) is very popular. From Year 7, students are given the opportunity to get involved in STEM challenge days and national STEM competitions, visits to the Big Bang Fair, engineering evenings with parents and Saturday morning engineering courses at Leonardo's in Luton.

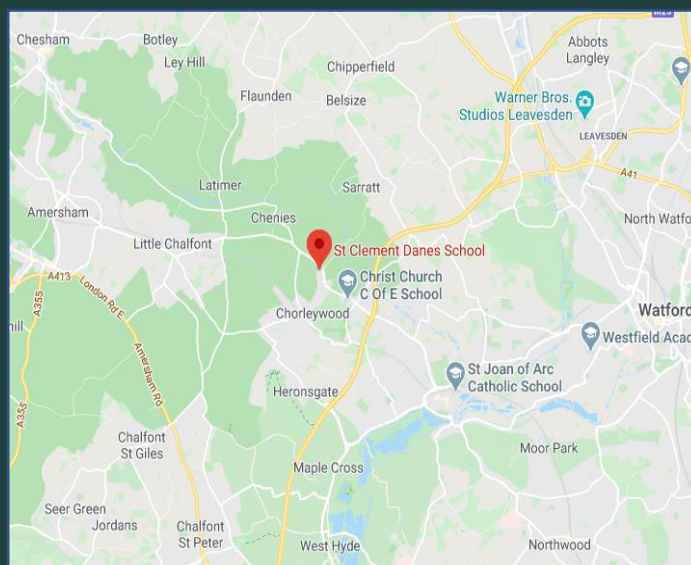
