We are highly a successful and oversubscribed school of 1000 students and are sponsored by the Redhill Academy Trust. Our school was last inspected by OFSTED in May 2017 and we were judged as being a 'good school'. The inspection report states that:

'The school is characterised by pupils who are well behaved, both in lessons and at other times around the school. There is a culture of respect and pupils are polite to each other and to adults. Staff expect pupils to achieve well and, as a parent rightly stated, 'Carlton Academy sets high expectations of its students.'

In addition, the report says:

"The points for improvement identified in the report following the inspection in 2013 have been tackled successfully. You have worked hard to eliminate less effective teaching and to ensure that teachers plan lessons that stretch and support pupils. Standards are now higher in many subject areas, including English and mathematics, and you now use the information you collect more effectively to support and challenge pupils with their learning"

Outcomes

Outcomes for all pupils have continued to rise both across the academy and within our subject areas. The team is focused on ensuring that we continue this very positive trend and continue to recruit more pupils into Key Stage 5 courses in our subject area. Facilities

We benefit from very well maintained and purpose built accommodation with high levels of access to ICT facilities. All classrooms are suited together to help provide an ethos of collaboration and support for all colleagues. The academy has continued to invest in our facilities and receives good levels of funding from the Redhill Trust to ensure we remain well-resourced and work in facilities that the staff and students can thrive within.

Curriculum

In Social Science, we offer broad range of subjects across Key Stages 4 & 5. In Key Stage 4, we offer the Level 2 CACHE Child Development & Care, as well as GCSE Psychology (AQA) and Sociology (WJEC). In Key Stage 5, we offer both AQA A Levels in Psychology and Sociology, as well as a Level 3 CACHE Health and Social Care; all of which are very popular subjects in the sixth form.

Network and CPD offer

We benefit from and contribute to the wide CPD offer in the academy and also the Trust subject networks. Working in partnership with other subject leaders and teachers provides us with the opportunity to share expertise and ensure we are continually able to reflect and further improve all that we do in order to raise the achievement of students.





Enrichment

We like to offer students a variety of enrichment opportunities whilst studying in our department and encourage them to take their learning outside of the classroom. For the last few years we have teamed up with the Science department to run a 'Brain Day' which has been led by lecturer Dr Guy Sutton. We have, in the past, also taken our students to the 'Life Behind Bars' and 'Psychology and Science' conferences, as well as to the National Conference of Young Women. This year, we are looking forward to running a Crime Scene Investigation day in school. Many of our Key Stage 5 students go on to study social science related courses at university and so many complete their sixth form work experience in this field; often within the NHS, care homes, mental health institutions and GP surgeries.
