•	deliver high quality specialist teaching ensuring therapeutic models of best practice to strengthen the pupils' whole learning experience			
•	plan opportunities to develop the social, emotional and cultural aspects of pupils' learning			
٠	provide clear structures for lessons which maintain pace, motivation and appropriate challenge			
•	deliver a bespoke Stage Not Age curriculum to all pupils			
•	include learning outside the classroom to enable students to engage with nature and to experience all curriculum areas in a variety of settings			
•	maintain and develop teaching and assessment materials			
•	 work in partnership with the HLTA in the whole teaching and learning experience adopting therapeutic models to address trauma, attachment disorder and other areas of dysfunction connected with SEMH needs 			
٠	ensure a consistent approach to managing behaviour and promote positive attitudes to learning			
٠	contribute to development planning, evaluation and quality improvement processes			
•	make effective use of assessment information on pupils' attainment and progress			
•	collect and record data to support teaching and learning targets
