Main duties/responsibilities

Job purpose

Main duties and responsibilities
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> deliver high quality specialist teaching ensuring therapeutic models of best practice to strengthen the pupils' whole learning experience
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> plan opportunities to develop the social, emotional and cultural aspects of pupils' learning
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> provide clear structures for lessons which maintain pace, motivation and appropriate challenge
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> deliver a bespoke Stage Not Age curriculum to all pupils
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> include learning outside the classroom to enable students to engage with nature and to experience all curriculum areas in a variety of settings
