

Job Title: Teaching Assistant Grade: Band 03, scale point 3-4

Core Purpose

As a Teaching Assistant, you will work alongside teachers to support pupils' learning, promote their independence, and help them achieve their best. Your role will involve direct work with students, contributing to lesson delivery, and ensuring an inclusive, safe, and supportive environment.

Main Responsibilities

The responsibilities of this role could vary as a result of new legislation, changes in technology or policy changes. This job description is not an exhaustive list of tasks of the role

- Support pupils' learning in the classroom and in small groups by helping them understand instructions, stay focused, and build confidence and independence.
- Work closely with the class teacher to adapt learning materials and activities to meet pupils' individual needs, including those with special educational needs or disabilities (SEND).
- Help maintain a positive and inclusive learning environment by promoting good behaviour, encouraging teamwork, and supporting pupils' emotional wellbeing.
- Prepare classroom resources, support with general admin tasks (e.g. photocopying, marking simple work), and help with the smooth running of lessons.
- Monitor and record pupils' progress, behaviour, and engagement in learning, providing regular feedback to the teacher and contributing to reviews and planning.
- Foster positive relationships with pupils, staff, and parents, working collaboratively with colleagues and external professionals to support each child's development.
- Ensure pupils' safety and wellbeing by following safeguarding procedures and maintaining professional boundaries at all times.
- Use ICT effectively to support learning activities and help pupils develop their digital skills.
- Participate in relevant training, team meetings, and whole-school activities to support the wider life and ethos of the school.

Professional Standards

You will be expected to uphold the Professional Standards for Teaching Assistants (2016), which include:

- 1. **Professional Conduct** Acting with honesty, integrity, and professionalism.
- 2. **Knowledge and Understanding** Supporting learning with relevant skills and subject knowledge.
- 3. **Teaching and Learning** Contributing to classroom delivery and learning outcomes.
- 4. **Working with Others** Collaborating with staff, parents, and pupils to support development.



Other Duties

- Attend mandatory training courses, e.g., Child Protection, Equal Opportunities and Health and Safety related courses
- Promote and celebrate an approach of equality, diversity and inclusion for all colleagues, students and external stakeholders.
- Responsible for the health and safety of themselves and others
- Responsible for the safeguarding of and promotion of wellbeing for both children and colleagues
- Be a team player and contribute towards the vision, culture and ethos of the Trust
- From time to time, you may be required to carry out other duties commensurate with the role.
