A WELCOME FROM THE CEO OF THE FRANK FIELD EDUCATION TRUST



The Frank Field Education Trust (FFET) is a multi-academy trust (MAT) based in two Regional Schools Commissioners areas (L&WY and West Midlands) which aims to build on the work of the Outstanding teachers, leaders and schools within the Trust to serve the most disadvantaged schools and communities in England.

The founder and Chair of the Trust, the Rt. Hon. Lord Frank Field, served for almost 40 years as the Member of Parliament for Birkenhead. During this time, Frank has written extensively on education and, in 2010, wrote "The Foundation Years: preventing poor children becoming poor adults" report, which is regarded as a landmark document regarding the importance of education and Early Years care in ending disadvantage. The review found that the gap in cognitive, social and emotional skills between the most and least disadvantaged students starts well before children enter the education system. This gap widens still further during school years.

Our intention is to work with schools that buck this national trend, with the aim of equalising or bettering life chances by the time our young people leave school. We believe social justice can be achieved through excellence in education.

We welcome applications from people who share our ambition to provide an education for children that is unparalleled in this country and have the enthusiasm and drive to make this a reality.

ELLESMERE PORT, CHESHIRE

Ellesmere Port is a port town in the Cheshire West and Chester local authority area of Cheshire, England. Ellesmere Port is 6 miles north of Chester, 12 miles south of Birkenhead, 16 miles southwest of Runcorn and 11 miles south of Liverpool.

The town of Ellesmere Port was originally established on the River Mersey at the entrance to the Ellesmere Canal. As well as a service sector economy, it has retained large industries including Stanlow oil refinery, a chemical works and the Vauxhall Motors car factory. There are also a number of tourist attractions including the National Waterways Museum, the Blue Planet Aquarium and Cheshire Oaks Designer Outlet.



JOB DESCRIPTION: Teaching Assistant

Grade/Salary Scale: Grade 4, Spinal Column Point 4 – 6 (35 hours – equating to £15,384 - £16,367)

Reports to: SENDCo

Working Pattern: Permanent (35 hours per week), part-time applicant considered

39 weeks per year (term time plus Inset days), 8.30am – 4.00pm

To support students, alongside teaching staff in the classroom and also to supervise and work closely with smaller groups of students, or individual students, who may need additional support.

Main Responsibilities:

- Assist teaching staff in the delivery of learning activities and work programmes and undertake
 predetermined activities with pupils so that their intellectual and social development (including self-reliance
 and self-esteem) is fostered.
- Provide input into the planning and evaluation of learning activities for individuals and groups of pupils to
 enable the teaching staff to make informed decisions when developing their plans.
- Supervise the activities of individuals or groups of pupils both in and out of the classroom (including
 educational visits) to ensure their safety and facilitate their physical and emotional development in
 accordance with the school's behaviour management policy.
- Monitor individual pupil's progress, achievements and development and report these to the teaching staff / line manager to inform decisions taken regarding the Individual Education Plan, Behaviour Plans and Personal Care Programmes for a pupil.
- Liaise with parents and carers in conjunction with the teaching staff to ensure effective communication concerning the pupils' well-being.
- Record pupil information, as specified by the teaching staff / line manager to ensure that the school's information systems are maintained.
- Attend to the personal, social and physical needs of pupils so that their well-being is maintained.
- Prepare and maintain learning equipment and ensure that the classroom is kept clean and tidy.
- Display and present the pupils' work under the direction of teaching staff, so that it enhances the classroom environment and celebrates achievement.
- Attend staff and other meetings and participate in staff training development work and staff reviews as required
- Perform any other duties as may be reasonably requested by the leadership team or Principal.

- Must have experience in communicating with parents, children and colleagues
- · Must have experience of building effective working relationships with students and colleagues
- Must have good ICT experience (in order to support learning)

- Must be aware of and promote and safeguard the welfare of children and young people (Enhanced DBS check required)
- Must be willing to undertake relevant training and development opportunities
- Must be able to work effectively within a team environment and undertake a range of Classroom roles and responsibilities
- Must be able to work with all children at all levels regardless of specific individual needs
- Must have an awareness of inclusion especially within a school setting
- Must have numeracy and literacy experience in a work setting
- Must have the ability to inspire, develop and motivate pupils through high expectations of behaviour and application to learning
- Must be able to demonstrate a genuine respect for all students
- Must display enthusiasm, commitment and flexibility and be able to thin clearly under pressure.

Based in Handforth, near Manchester, this outstanding primary school and National Support School leads the way in innovative curriculum development and inclusion.


Birches Head Academy
