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# Job Description

The information contained below is to help staff understand and appreciate the work content of their post and the role they are to play in the operation. Broad headings may therefore have been used; in which case all the usual associated duties are included in this job description.

<b>Job title</b>	SEN Teaching Assistant, Level 2 (Secondary Phase)
<b>Reporting to</b>	Director of SEN, Inclusion Team Lead, TA Management Team
<b>Main purpose of job</b>	<p>To work under the instruction/guidance of teachers/senior staff to undertake work/care/support programmes to enable access to learning for EHCP/SEND pupils.</p> <p>Work may be carried out in the classroom or outside the main teaching area. May be required to supervise groups of pupils undertaking activities in non-teaching situations.</p> <p>To promote the safety and well-being of pupils in accordance with school policies.</p>

## Key responsibilities:

### Support for Pupils

- Supervise and provide particular support for pupils, including those with SEND, ensuring their safety and access to learning activities.
- Assist with the development and implementation of individual education/ behaviour plans and personal care programmes including pastoral, social, health, nutrition, physical hygiene, physiotherapy, minor first aid and welfare matters.
- Establish constructive relationships with pupils and interact with them according to individual needs.
- Set challenging and demanding expectations and promote self-esteem and independence.
- Encourage pupils to interact with other and engage in activities led by teaching staff.
- Provide feedback to pupils in relation to progress and achievement under the guidance of the teacher.
- Promote the inclusion and acceptance of all pupils.
- Act as a keyworker to nominated pupils.

### Support for Teachers

- Create and maintain a purposeful, orderly and supportive environment, in accordance with lesson plans and assist with the display of pupils' work
- Use strategies, in liaison with the teacher, to support pupils to achieve learning goals
- Monitor pupils' responses to learning activities and accurately record achievement/progress as directed
- Provide detailed and regular feedback to teachers on pupil's achievement, progress, difficulties etc.
- Promote good pupil behaviour, dealing promptly with conflict and incidents in line with established policy and encourage pupils to take responsibility for their own behaviour
- Establish constructive relationships with parents/carers
- Administer routine tests and invigilate exams where required.

### Support for the Curriculum

- Provide Curriculum / resource support and undertake programmes linked to local and national learning strategies.
- Support the use of ICT in learning activities and develop pupils' competence and independence in its use.
- Prepare and maintain equipment/resources as directed and assist pupils in their use.

- Take an active role in developing relevant subject knowledge, specialist skills, knowledge to support pupils with SEN or physical disabilities and behaviour management strategies as appropriate.
- Undertake structured and agreed learning activities/teaching programmes, adjusting activities according to pupil responses

### **Support for the School**

- Be aware of and support difference and ensure all pupils have equal access to opportunities to learn and develop
- Contribute to the overall ethos/work/aims of the school
- Appreciate and support the role of other professionals
- Attend and participate in relevant meetings as required
- Participate in training and other learning activities and performance development as required
- Assist with the supervision of pupils in non-teaching times, including before and after school and at lunchtime
- Accompany teaching staff and pupils on visits, trips and out of school activities as required and take responsibility for a group under the supervision of the teacher

### **All employees have the responsibility to:**

- Ensure any documentation produced is to a high standard and is in line with the brand style
- Be aware and comply with all policies and procedures relating to safeguarding, child protection, health, safety and security, confidentiality and data protection, reporting all concerns to the appropriate person
- Participate in training and other learning activities as required
- Participate in the school/academy Performance Management process
- Provide appropriate guidance and supervision and assist in the training and development of staff as appropriate
- To promote the area of responsibility within the school/academy and beyond
- To represent the school/academy at events as appropriate
- To support and promote the school/academy ethos
