

ASPIRE at Sir John Nelthorpe School

The ASPIRE Centre is a purpose-built specialist resourced provision located on the campus of Sir John Nelthorpe School. The Centre specialises in working with individuals on the Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) continuum. With a focus on fostering personal growth, independence, and resilience, ASPIRE offers a safe, structured, and inclusive environment where young people can thrive academically, socially, and emotionally.

Capacity and Staffing

The ASPIRE Centre accommodates a maximum of 12 pupils at any one time, offering both full-time and part-time placements tailored to individual needs.

Permanent Staff:

- **Centre Manager:** Oversees the daily operations, pupil support strategies, the quality of education, and engagement with families and external agencies.
- Learning Mentor: Provides one-to-one and group support, ensuring tailored learning strategies and interventions.
- Teaching Assistant: Provides one-to-one and group support as directed by the Learning Mentor and Centre Manager.
- ASPIRE Administrator: Manages administrative duties, scheduling, and communication with families and professionals.

Additional Support:

Flexible staffing includes input from wider external agencies such as educational psychologists, speech and language therapists, or occupational therapists as required.

Facilities and Environment

ASPIRE is thoughtfully designed to meet the diverse needs of its pupils, featuring:

- **Two dedicated learning environments:** These rooms provide calm, adaptable spaces for focused academic learning and skill development.

- Centre Manager's office and meeting room: For private discussions with pupils, families, and external professionals.
- Admin/Reception office: A welcoming hub for managing daily operations and inquiries.
- A secure outdoor space: A safe, enclosed area for physical activity, sensory breaks, and outdoor learning.
- A small cafe-style dining facility and kitchenette: A homely space promoting independence through meal preparation and social dining experiences.
