Cheetwood Primary School is seeking a dedicated and enthusiastic **Level 3 Teaching Assistant** to join our supportive and nurturing team. The successful candidate will primarily work within our Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS), supporting high-quality learning through play, communication, and early development.
