

Teaching Assistant - Job Description

To support and develop learning in the school in order that the children can achieve their potential academically, socially, intellectually, emotionally and physically through confidential flexible practices.
 Support for the teacher Planning with the class teacher for the provision of resources for lessons etc. To help teachers prepare for and execute lessons by being aware of lesson objectives and activities. To help with the assessment of students' needs and progress as appropriate. To provide support, as required, when a teacher is helping a student who has immediate needs relating to their learning, health, welfare or conduct. To contribute to the management of children's behaviour in a positive manner. Support for the children To help develop student's self-esteem by showing interest in their work and by praising their achievements. To motivate and encourage children to develop their knowledge, understanding and skills across the curriculum. To encourage and support all children to develop independent learning. To alert appropriate colleagues to matters that may affect the learning or welfare of a student e.g. bullying, possible abuse, violent conduct, emotional outbursts, physical, medical or sensory difficulties, language problems, social problems etc. Being adaptable and flexible in applying our knowledge and skills to enhance children's understanding, taking into account different levels and abilities. To ensure that every child is noticed and valued. To make learning fun and to promote discussion with and between the children. Support for the School To welcome the children and parents. To help raise school standards and the quality of school life:
 By supporting small groups and individuals thereby releasing teachers to help other students make progress at a faster rate. By helping to promote social awareness and cooperation through small group work. By providing extra adult supervision and supporting school visits during schools hours, including a play-time duty. To undertake other duties from time to time as agreed with the Classroom Teacher and Headteacher.

Support with the Curriculum

- To play an active part in implementing the English, Maths and Phonics schemes.
- To support students across the curriculum and to help develop their knowledge of each subject.

Other Professional Responsibilities

- To participate in all arrangements for Performance Management including training as required.
- Participate in supervising students at break-time, after suitable training.
- Performing lunchtime supervisor responsibilities.
