- Use **specialist strategies**, **interventions**, and **resources** to support learning and behaviour.
- Monitor and record progress, contributing to assessments, reviews, and meetings.
- Support children with personal care where necessary and ensure their safety and wellbeing at all times.
- Communicate effectively with parents and carers, maintaining a professional and empathetic approach.
