Key Purpose of Job

Responsible for supporting pupils with their learning under the guidance of the class teacher, including:

- Helping children of all abilities, including those with special educational needs, to learn as effectively and independently as possible, individually, in small groups and within the classroom environment.
- May include lunchtime duties

Duties (not exhaustive):

The Teaching Assistant will:

- support and uphold the school's vision and values
- run a range of interventions to support individuals and small groups
- prepare materials and resources to support individuals, small groups and classroom activities
- work with children on individual targets in reading, writing and maths
- support children's emotional development and resilience when approaching learning tasks
- support children's behaviour in line with the school's behaviour policy
- provide lunchtime support in the hall and on the playground as required
- assist with duties as required
- have an awareness of and adherence to all school safeguarding procedures and participate in training as appropriate
- ensure the health and safety of the children and to report any concerns or details of accidents/incidents as necessary to the relevant persons
- assist in the general care of the learning environment by keeping curriculum resources in classrooms and around the school, tidy and in good order
- support the school's wide range of extracurricular activities
- support class teachers with educational visits including taking responsibility for the care, welfare and learning of individuals and small groups of children

This is not an exhaustive list of duties; they may be varied from time to time without changing the general character of the job or the level of responsibility. A high degree of flexibility and adaptability is an important element of this role.
