Timetabled Allocation from September 2021:

In Years 7, 8 and 9 – all pupils will have 200 minutes of French <u>and</u> 200 minutes of German teaching over the two-week timetable, split into lessons of 100 minutes each.

Year 10 and 11 GCSE classes will have 300 minutes of their chosen language(s) over the fortnight. Pupils who study two languages have 300 minutes of each language.

Facilities

There is a dedicated area of school with MFL classrooms. Each teacher has his/her own laptop and all teaching rooms are equipped with an interactive whiteboard. In addition, teachers can book one of the ICT rooms for cross-curricular use as required. We have a MFL Resource office and have access to a variety of resources and online materials to aid teaching and learning. As a school, we use the Firefly portal to assign tasks, upload lessons and deliver homework.

Educational Visits

We currently offer our pupils three opportunities to take part in residential visits abroad – these visits have all been embedded across the school for many years and always prove to be immensely popular – in Year 8, we go to Paris. Year 10 is a visit to the Schwarzwald area of Germany, but close enough to the French border to be of benefit to learners of either language. In Year 11, we run a cross-curricular visit with the History Department to Berlin. It is desirable that department members are willing to participate in these, or any future visits, where able.
